COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Art Elements and Principles of Design will continue to be a foundation for all artmaking within the classroom. Art 2 is an opportunity for students to explore new concepts and illustrate techniques found throughout Art History. Students will be exposed to a highlighted "artist in study" for each project produced, as well as some background content about the individual's life. This is a "project based" course. Therefore, it is imperative that students attend all class sessions or they may fall behind in class. Students who wish to continue into the art pathway (Art 3 or AP Art) must receive a "B" or better <u>each semester</u>.

CLASS EXPECTATIONS:

- Respect between individuals. Respect for the materials & tools used in the classroom. Respect for the work of others.
- When the instructor is talking : Listen, make eye contact, and ask questions when necessary.
- Cell phones or electronic devices must be put away during lecture/demos.
- Food or drinks are not allowed within the classroom. The only exception is water.
- Students must stay in their assigned seats the entire duration of class. Any student out of their seats are at risk of being marked absent and losing participation points.
- Students are expected to do their own work and will neither be given nor received unauthorized assistance (i.e. doing another student's work) on assignments for this class.
- The bell doesn't dismiss you, I do. Please <u>do not</u> wait by the door.

<u>GRADING POLICY</u>

Grades will be based on the timely completion of projects, following directions, neatness of work, creativity and effort, utilizing all class time, as well as several written art critiques. Visual Journal Assignments aka "Art Prompts" are due at the end of each grading period (every 6 weeks).

Students who turn in a project/assignment late will receive a maximum of 75%. If a student is absent, it is the <u>student's responsibility</u> to make arrangements with the instructor to make up any missed work. I only give extensions to artists who have worked diligently inside and outside the classroom to meet the original deadline but due to high quality and care, we are unable to. Extensions are not given to those who waste time and simply want more.

I realize that most students have significant amounts of homework. Homework is extremely rare in my class. Therefore, students will be expected to use class time effectively.

PARTICIPATION POINTS

Participation points are worth 5% of a student's overall grade. During a zoom meeting, these are some key factors I look for from the students:
